

Join the Schererville Police Department for the 17th annual National Night Out Against Crime campaign from 5 to 9 p.m. on Tuesday, August 6 at Redar Park, 217 Gregory St.

You can enjoy refreshments provided by food trucks and listen to live music performed by "The Frito Pact Band". Bounce houses and a kid's game booth with giveaway prizes will keep the children entertained. There will also be a K-9 demonstration featuring Schererville's K-9 Team. Come check out police vehicles and specialized equipment from the Northwest Regional SWAT Team.

"This event is designed to generate public support and participation for law enforcement and anticrime programs. We have a lot of young police officers and this is an opportunity to interact with them," said Schererville Police Chief Peter Sormaz. "It is a way for the community to come together to celebrate its resolve to reduce crime."

In past years, this event has been well received by

the community with an average of 1,500 in attendance each year, he noted.

Sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch in the United States, the National Night Out Against Crime began simply in 1984 with neighbors turning on porch lights and sitting in front of their homes, Chief Sormaz said.

"That first National Night Out involved 2.5 million residents across 400 communities in 23 states. In 2016, the National Night Out involved 38 million people in 16,000 communities across the United States," he said.

What NOT to flush down your toilet or pour down your drain

Schererville residents whose homes are connected to the sewer system need to be very careful about what **shouldn't** be flushed down the toilets or poured down the drains, said Chad Nondorf, Schererville Public Works Director.

Examples of what should NOT be flushed down toilets or poured down drains include the following:


- Cloth rags or towels
- Baby wipes, toilet wipes, disinfecting wipes or cloth wipes of any kind (even if the container indicates that they are "flushable")
- Paper (other than toilet paper/tissue)
- Medications (Prescription or over-the-counter)
- Feminine hygiene products of any kind
- Beauty projects, Q-Tips, dental floss
- Plastics of any kind
 Grease of any kind especially cooking grease

- Garden supplies (such as pesticides, fertilizers)
 Paint, varnish, paint remover
- Motor oil, gasoline, or any explosive material.

All of the above items should be thrown out with the trash or disposed of properly, Nondorf said. Clogged pipes lead to sewer backups which can then back up into homes and are costly to repair for the homeowner, he said, adding that only urine, feces and toilet paper should be flushed down toilets. Clogged lift station pumps could also cause backups and damage to homes, he said.

"Please share this information with all members of your household," Nondorf said. "If you have an outside contractor come in to clean your home, please be sure to pass this information on to them as well."







Preparing for future emergencies goal of meeting

On February 29, a massive fire at the Sherwood Lake apartment complex changed the lives of 40 residents who called the 36-unit structure home. Preparing for future emergencies in St. John Township such as this fire brought together police and fire chiefs, town managers, and local church representatives to meet with the Red Cross on April 25, said Cathy Lareau, St. John Township Trustee, who organized the meeting at the St. John Community Center along with Schererville Police Chief Peter Sormaz.

"We met with John Montgomery, Disaster Program Specialist for the Northwest Chapter of the Red Cross, to discuss how we can collaborate together and identify resources that we can bring together to best serve our township residents," Lareau said. "The meeting let first responders know what the Red Cross does and how they can utilize those resources."

Shelter, food and clothing are among the immediate needs in a disaster, she noted, adding that setting up large emergency shelters and providing transportation to those shelters was discussed. "I have a township bus that can be used to transport people," Lareau said. "We also have case managers who can help residents."

Chief Sormaz said Schererville Police Officers responded to the Sherwood Lake Apartments fire at 11:47 p.m. and began evacuating residents after seeing smoke coming from the third floor of the complex. Three minutes later the Schererville Fire Department arrived, he said.

That coordinated response helped save lives, Chief Sormaz said. "We have immediate resources available to assist in emergencies, including evacuations."

Lareau said Montgomery distributed agreements to representatives from local churches noting how the churches can partner with the Red Cross to set up emergency centers. The police and fire chiefs were also provided more information about the Red Cross and how that organization responds to emergencies, she said.

Part of the Red Cross Indiana Region, the Northwest Chapter covers 18 Indiana counties with offices in Merrillville, Michigan City, South Bend and Plymouth, Montgomery said.

"Our main mission is to feed and shelter people in times of disaster," said Montgomery. "Our first goal is that everyone has a safe, warm, dry place to stay that night. We respond to single-home fires daily. We help more people with single-home fires than we did in Hurricane Katrina."

The Red Cross also offers health services to replace prescriptions and durable medical equipment such as CPAP machines and walkers lost in fires or other disasters. In addition, disaster mental health services and non-denominational disaster spiritual services can be provided, he said.

"All of these services are offerings, not mandatory," Montgomery noted. "We have caseworkers that do follow-ups and make referrals to partners in the community. We work to provide a new normal."


