THEREUPON, Reports

Fire Chief Patterson reported that for the month of March the Fire Department responded to 305 incidents, of which 256 were EMS related, 49 were fire related. Chief Patterson stated that the Fire engine that is being built at this time is on schedule, and due to be completed in December 2021. Chief Patterson gave an update on the South Haven Baby Box. He stated it is installed in Station II, it is being tested at this time and he just received confirmation from Safe Haven that we are going to set the date for May 4, 2021 at 2:00 pm at Fire Station II. Chief Patterson stated that Mr. Huet and his crew did a great job in getting the concrete pad poured out there.

Mr. Schmitt congratulated Police Chief Sormaz and the Police Department on your CALEA Certification. Chief Sormaz thanked Mr. Schmitt and stated they are still waiting on the final report.

ITEM A. Ord. #1963, An Ordinance Annexing Certain Contiguous Land to the Town of Schererville, Lake County, Indiana, And all Matters Related Thereto (Second Reading)

Mr. Volkmann stated that this is a single family home in the Auburn Meadow Subdivision off of US 41. He stated that Mr. Foley's desire is to hook up to the Town's utilities. Mr. Volkmann stated that we have to extend water and sewer lines in this area for him to make the connection. He stated that this is the last hearing on this petition for annexation.

Mr. Johnson asked Mr. Volkmann if there are other properties along this road that are not annexed. Mr. Volkmann stated yes there are. Mr. Volkmann stated that as they come in we have required them to annex into Town. Mr. Volkmann stated that some of the septic's are failing in some of the houses, so they pay for the extension of the utilities, their pro rata share of the utilities.

Mr. Johnson made a motion to adopt Ordinance #1963, seconded by Mr. Connelly. All in favor (5-0).

ITEM A. Ord. #1965, An Ordinance Establishing Policies and Procedures for Authorized Financial Instruments for Payment to the Town/Municipality in Conformance with Applicable Law, Repealing all Ordinances and Town Code Provisions, or Parts Thereof, in Conflict Herewith, and All Matters Related Thereto

Mr. Troxell stated that this Ordinance is basically updating an older Ordinance that we had, this brings in some of Indiana Codes that have been updated over the years in order for us to make payments to our vendors and receive payments from our customers. Mr. Troxell stated that this allows us to make some electronic transfer payments, ACH payments and wire transfer payments. Mr. Troxell stated it updates what we had and allows us to become more efficient in our payment methods. He stated we will still follow the same procedures we had before and authorizing payments that go out of the office.

Mr. Connelly made a motion to consider on $1^{\rm st}$ reading, Ordinance #1965, seconded by Mr. Johnson. All in favor (5-0).

ITEM B. Res. #2021-7, A Resolution Authorizing Entry into a 2021 Vehicle and Equipment Lease-Purchase Financing Agreement with Bank of America for Purchase of Vehicles and Equipment for the Town of Schererville, Lake County, Indiana, and all Matters Related Thereto

Mr. Troxell stated this is an authorizing Resolution to have our Town Council President engage in the Lease Purchase Agreement. He stated that this is for the financing of the vehicles and equipment. Mr. Troxell stated that 1.3 million dollars is the financing, the rate on this is 1.049%, for four years. Mr. Troxell stated that if the Resolution is approved this evening, he will work on finalizing the documentation and the closing would be this Friday, April 16, 2021. He stated once approved, the money would be deposited to an escrow account and we would draw on that as we expend monies toward the purchase of the vehicles.

Mr. Schmitt made a motion to adopt Resolution #2021-7, seconded by Mrs. Arvanitis. All in favor (5-0).

ITEM C. Consider Approval of Reimbursement in the Amount of \$29,118.69 to Kelly Law Offices LLC located at 1619 Junction Avenue for Completion of the Façade Program (From Redevelopment Commission Agenda)

Mr. Johnson made a motion to approve the reimbursement in the amount of \$29,118.69 to Kelly Law Offices LLC for completion of the Façade Program, seconded by Mr. Connelly. All in favor (5-0).

ITEM D. Consider Acceptance of Agreement between the Town of Schererville and the Northwest Indiana Symphony Society, Inc. (\$12,000.00)

Mr. Volkmann stated that they went out for mowing bids for 2021 and they received five bids. He stated he would like to recommend awarding the bid to Great Lakes Landscape Management, in the amount of \$115,310.00.

Mr. Schmitt made a motion to award the bid to Great Lakes Landscape Management, seconded by Mr. Johnson. All in favor (5-0).

ITEM G. Consider Approval to Extend Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA), which Expired March 31, 2021, To Compensate up to Eighty (80) Hours Paid Leave to Employees that are off Work due to Covid-19, Retroactive to April 1, 2021 and Expiring September 30, 2021.

Mr. Volkmann stated that the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA), which expired March 31, 2021, has been extended until September 30, 2021. Mr. Volkmann stated the clock begins anew on April 1, 2021.

Mr. Connelly made a motion to extend the FFCRA to September 30, 2021, seconded by Mr. Johnson. All in favor (5-0).
